RULES AND REGULATIONS

1001 ADMINISTRATION

1001.1

The entire administration of the US Youth Soccer Wisconsin State Championship competition is vested in the US Youth Soccer Wisconsin State Championship Committee.

1001.2

Once the US Youth Soccer Wisconsin State Championship committee has established the structure (brackets) of the US Youth Soccer Wisconsin State Championship competition, issues not provided for in the rules and regulations may be adjusted for as needed on the recommendation of the US Youth Soccer Wisconsin State Championship Chair, with the approval of the US Youth Soccer Wisconsin State Championship Committee.

1001.3

The US Youth National Championship Rules and the US Youth Soccer Midwest Regional Championship Rules and Regulations shall govern the US Youth Soccer Wisconsin State Championship unless otherwise provided for in this document. Additionally, any matter not provided for in this document shall be decided upon by the US Youth Soccer Wisconsin State Championship Committee, the decision of the US Youth Soccer Wisconsin State Championship Committee will comply with, in order, regional and national guidelines.

1001.4

The decisions of the US Youth Soccer Wisconsin State Championship Committee in all matters are binding and final and allow the competition to go forward.

1001.5

No member of USYSA, an official, district, league, club, administrator, team, coach, player or referee may invoke any aid of the courts of the United States, State or municipality without first exhausting all available remedies within the appropriate soccer organizations and provided within USYSA, specifically USYSA BYLAW 704.

1001.6 Warm-ups

No warm-ups (including goalies) on any tournament field inside the 18 yard line prior to, during, or after State Championship games.

1001.7 Pets

No pets are allowed in the soccer park

1001.8 Protests

1001.8.1

Play-In Games - The referee(s) and the opposing coach must be notified in writing of a protest immediately at the conclusion of the game, before the referee crew departs the game site. A written statement of the protest must be filed with the referee accompanied with a \$150.00 check for the protest fee. Check made payable to WYSA. Protests must clearly articulate the disputed matter. The decisions of the referee regarding facts connected with play are final. The referee must immediately mail the team rosters, game report, protest fee and written protest to the Wisconsin Youth Soccer State Office (Attention State Championship Administrator). The referee shall also notify the US Youth Soccer Wisconsin State Championship Administrator via e-mail that a protest has been filed. A decision of the US Youth Soccer Wisconsin State Championship Committee shall be made within 48 hours of receipt of the hard copy protest by the Wisconsin Youth Soccer State Office.

1001.8.2

Group Play, Semi Final and Final Games - The Site Manager or Tournament Director and the opposing coach must be notified of a protest at the conclusion of the game but not more than 30 minutes after completion of the game in question. A written statement of protest, from the team representative, must be filed with the Site Manager or Tournament Director and must be accompanied with a \$150.00 protest fee. Check made payable to WYSA. The written statement of protest must clearly articulate the disputed matter. A decision of the Wisconsin US Youth Soccer Wisconsin State Championship Committee shall be rendered within 120 minutes of receipt of the protest. The team representative must be a member parent from at least one of the registered players on the current team roster or a person designated as the team contact on the Team Information Form.

1001.8.3

For all protests, a lawyer shall not represent a team at a hearing of a charge of protest unless she/he is a bona fide member of one of the teams concerned. The decisions of the referee regarding facts connected with play are final. The referee may only reverse their original decision (at his/her discretion) or on the advice of an assistant referee (or 4th official) provided that play had not been restarted. Decisions of the US Youth Soccer Wisconsin State Championship Committee are final and binding. No member of USYSA an official, district, league, club, administrator, team, coach, player or referee may invoke any aid of the courts of the United States, State or municipality without first exhausting all available remedies within the appropriate soccer organizations and provided within USYSA, specifically USYSA BYLAW 704. For the violation of USYSA Bylaw 704, the offending party shall be subject to suspension and fines, and shall be liable to WYSA and USYSA for all expenses incurred by WYSA or USYSA and its officers and members of the Board of Directors in defending each court action, including the following:

- 1) Court costs
- 2) Attorney's fees

- 3) Reasonable compensation for time spent by WYSA or USYSA officials and employees in responding to and defending against allegations in the action, including responses to discovery and court appearances
- 4) Travel expenses
- 5) Expenses for holding special State Board meeting or Special National Council meetings necessitated by court action

1001.9 Playing Venues

It is the intent of the Wisconsin State Championship Committee to assure our venues are maintained in a clean environment for all to enjoy. To reinforce this requirement, the Wisconsin State Championship Committee may levy a fine against any team that does not police it's bench area following it's game.

1002 TEAM ENTRY

1002.1 Ages

The Wisconsin US Youth Soccer Wisconsin State Championship shall be an open tournament event to any properly registered team that is in compliance with rule 221 of the US Youth Soccer National Championship Policies. The tournament accepts teams in the following boys and girls' age groups: U13 U14, U15, U16, U17, U18 and U19.

1002.2 Fees

The US Youth Soccer Wisconsin State Championship team entry fee shall be established by the US Youth Soccer Wisconsin State Championship Committee prior to the start of each of year's tournament. Entry fees shall be submitted to the state association by the published deadline dates for the respective age/gender divisions. Teams drawn into a play-in game and losing the play-in game shall have a portion of the team entry fee refunded at the conclusion of fall or spring competition period.

1002.3 Application

Any team entering the US Youth Soccer Wisconsin State Championship must submit a completed application and submit the appropriate application fee by the published deadline date for the respective age/gender divisions. All teams submitting an application to compete in the US Youth Soccer Wisconsin State Championship agree to abide by the rules and regulations of the US Youth Soccer Wisconsin State Championship, the WI Youth Soccer Association, US Youth Soccer Region II, US Youth Soccer's National Championships Series and US Soccer Federation where applicable.

1002.4 Withdrawal

Teams withdrawing from the Wisconsin US Youth Soccer Wisconsin State Championship must submit in writing to the US Youth Soccer Wisconsin State Championship Administrator a notice of withdrawal. Teams withdrawing from the tournament after the "draw for brackets" has been conducted shall forfeit the entry fee. Withdrawals will be accepted up to 30 days prior to the first game the team is to play. Following this date, teams may be fined for a forfeit if they drop out of the tournament.

1002.5 Forfeits

Any team forfeiting a game in the Wisconsin US Youth Soccer Wisconsin State Championship will be fined up to \$300.00 per game. Fines are assessed against the member team and member soccer club.

All forfeited games will be posted as a 4-0 loss.

In addition to the financial fines, all remaining games for that years state championships will be recorded as a forfeit, the club will not be allowed to field a team in the Wisconsin State Championships in the appropriate age group the team would be in the following year. If the team (team is defined as a minimum of 50% of the players) moves to a different club they will not be eligible to participate in the following years Wisconsin State Championships. .

1002.6 Seeding

The prior year semifinalists will be seeded in each of the four competitive brackets. The two finalists would be placed in brackets A & B with the remaining semifinalists placed in brackets C & D. The remaining slots will be filled using a double blind draw. If less than four brackets for group play are drawn then only the previous years' finalist and runner up will be seeded. The U13 age division's top four teams will be seeded based on Wisconsin State Premier League standings from the previous season standings.

If a club enters multiple teams in an age group they will be placed in separate brackets. Starting in the fall of 2011 seeding, for the U-16, U-17 and U-18 age groups will be expanded to include the teams that finish second in their round robin group in the previous year's state championships. These teams will be seeded such that they will not play in the same round robin group as the team that finished first in their group the year prior. These teams are eligible for play-in games based on the criteria in section 2001.5.1.

If a team that was to be seeded from the previous year elects not to participate in the State Championships in the present year, their seeded spot will be filled during the blind draw

2001. PLAYING RULES

2001.1 Laws of the Game

Unless expressly written elsewhere, FIFA's Laws of the Game are applied with the accepted US Youth Soccer modifications.

2001.2 Substitution

2001.4 Overtime

Reference US Youth Soccer National Championship Polices. See chart in section 4001 for duration of overtime for play-in, semi final and final games.

2001.5 Play-In Games

In age groups where an uneven number of teams enter the tournament or total number of teams exceeds 16, play-in games will be used to narrow the field to an even number of teams, or a maximum of 16 teams for group play. Play-in games must be completed seven days prior to the start of group play. Winners in a play-in game will be placed in the group play bracket. If a match is tied at the end of regulation, overtime rules (or variations to the overtime rules as agreed by both coaches and the center referee) shall be used to determine a winner.

Play-in game results are not applied to group play standings. Play-in game results do not apply for the purposes of determining a group winner or for tie breaking procedures for group play.

2001.5.1 Eligibility for play-in games:

1. The top four seeded teams in an group will be exempt from play-in games unless the remaining pool of teams (all other teams including Midwest and State Premier League Teams) is not large enough to populate all of the play-in games required.
2. Teams currently a member of the Midwest Regional League or the Wisconsin State Premier League are exempt from participating in play-in games, unless the remaining pool of teams is not large enough to populate all of the play-in games required.
3. If the pool of non Midwest Regional League Teams and State Premier League Teams is not large enough to populate all of the play-in games the following shall apply:
 - a. State Premier League Teams will be included in the play-in pool. Premier League Teams will be taken into the pool based on the most recent Premier League Standings, starting from the last place team and working up to the first place team to fill play-in game requirements. For example, if the Premier League has eight teams and four teams are required to completely populate the pool, teams five through eight in the standing will be brought into the play-in game pool.
 - i. If Premier League teams and no Midwest Regional League teams, are required to become part of the play-in game pool, it will be the intent, where possible, that the Premier League teams will be seeded into the play-in games, such that no Premier League team will play another during the play-in round.
 - b. If all Premier League teams are in the play-in pool and additional teams are required, Midwest Regional League teams will become eligible for the play-in pool. Similar to the Premier League teams, the Midwest Regional League teams will be brought into the play-in game pool by most recent Midwest Regional League standings.
 - i. If Midwest Regional League teams, are required to become part of the play-in game pool, it will be the intent, where possible, that the

Midwest League teams will be seeded into the play-in games, such that no Midwest League team will play another during the play-in round.

2001.5.2 Play-In Game Dates:

All spring play-in games will be scheduled for the last weekend of April with rain dates of the first weekend of May. Games will be grouped in a limited number of locations. Games and game times will be scheduled by the Wisconsin State Championship Committee.

For fall play-in games the Wisconsin State Championship Committee reserves the right to schedule all play-in games on a specific date.

2001.6 Scoring Method

See the Midwest Regional Championship Rules & Regulations

2001.7 Tie Breakers

At the conclusion of group play, in the event teams are tied on the basis of points earned, group winner advancement shall be determined in accordance with the following sequential criteria:

- A. Winner of head to head competition
- B. Winner most games in group play
 - a. Does not apply if more than two teams tied
- C. Goals scored minus goals allowed (maximum of four goals differential per game will be credited)
- D. Fewest goals allowed (maximum of four goals per game)
- E. Sportsman and Fair Play points
- F. Kicks from the mark

2001.8 Player's Equipment

Each player of a team is required to wear like uniforms within a team (same jerseys with numbers, same shorts and same socks). Goalkeepers must wear a jersey that distinguishes themselves from their teammates, the opposing team's players, the opposing goalkeeper and whenever possible, the referees. In the event of a color conflict, the listed home team shall change colors. Teams and goalkeepers are asked to be mindful of referee uniform colors. No casts or jewelry are permitted at any time.

2001.9 Credentials

Each player listed on the official team roster and official game day roster must carry a current and valid US Youth Soccer membership pass card. The US Youth Soccer membership pass card must carry a current photograph of the player, be signed by that player and the appropriate official of the State Association (or district registrar) and must be date stamped by the appropriate official of the State Association (or district registrar). All member passes must be laminated. Players without US Youth Soccer member passes shall not participate in the US Youth Soccer Wisconsin State Championship.

Each coach listed on the official team roster or official game day roster must carry a current State issued coach pass card (mandatory for all listed coaches). The game day coach must have in his/her possession their State issued coach pass card that shows the appropriate license level. U15 and above State League and Midwest League team coaches must show a “D” level or higher. All other coaches must have a coach pass with an “E” level or higher.

Each additional team official listed on the official team roster or the official game day roster must carry either a US Youth Soccer membership pass (manager) or a State issued pass card (coaches). No other persons are permitted on the team side of the field without a valid pass card issued by the State or District Office.

A team can have a maximum of four coaches/managers on the sideline of any game. Coaches and/or managers must check with onsite registration to receive a wrist band for all group play, semi final and final games, if they wish to be on the sidelines of any game.

2001.11 Eligibility

A player may only play for one team during the Wisconsin State Championships. (i.e. a female player who is U14 age appropriate competes with a U15 team in the fall. That female player then transfers to a U14 team in the spring and that U14 team enters the US Youth Soccer Wisconsin State Championship; that player is not eligible to play with the U14 team in the US Youth Soccer Wisconsin State Championship as she had competed with the U15 team during the fall portion of the tournament.) This includes players who are added to the roster by using a club pass.

Refer to NCS rules for additional information regarding playing for a different team in the regional or national championships.

2001.12 Red Cards

Any player, coach or spectator dismissed from a game shall be ineligible to participate in the team's next game of the US Youth National Championship Series. At the discretion of the US Youth Soccer Wisconsin State Championship Committee, the suspension may be increased which may include expulsion from the remainder of the tournament competition (and carry over to the next year); subject to the severity of the offense. A player who has been sent from the field of play may not be replaced for the remainder of the game concerned. All red card ejections carry a minimum of a one game suspension subject to the severity of the offense. Red cards follow the player (and not the team) and shall carryover from game to game and/or competition period (i.e. last game of the previous year's US Youth Soccer National Championship Series Game to the next year's US Youth Soccer Wisconsin State Championship). Coaches and spectators asked to leave a game must depart so that they are considered “out of sight/out of sound”. The name of any person that carries a suspension will be recorded by the US Youth Soccer Wisconsin State Championship Administrator.

2001.13 Yellow Card Accumulation Rule

Players shown a yellow card in two consecutive state championship games (round robin, semi final or final) will automatically be suspended from the next game.

2002 OFFICIAL GAME

2002.1 Official Game

See the Midwest Regional Rules and Regulations

2002.2 Temporary Suspensions: Inclement Weather

At a play-in game: In the event of inclement weather when a match is temporarily suspended, when possible, a grace period of at least 30 minutes in accordance with USSF Policy shall be adhered to, in the interest of completing the match.

In group play and/or semi finals and finals: The US Youth Soccer Wisconsin State Championship Committee shall determine the length of the grace period in accordance with USSF Policy in the interest of completing matches.

2002.3 Grace Period: Team No Show

A minimum of seven players constitutes a team. A ten minute grace period shall be extended beyond the scheduled kickoff time if seven players are not available at the scheduled kick-off time. As soon as seven players are available to play, the game shall begin. If at the conclusion of the ten minute grace period, a team does not have seven players, the referee shall suspend the game and report the failure of the team to appear to the US Youth Soccer Wisconsin State Championship Tournament Site Manager (group play) or State Office (play-in). The US Youth Soccer Wisconsin State Championship Committee may declare a forfeit. Any team that forfeits a game will not be allowed to advance out of the group play into the semi finals. In the event of a forfeit, the score awarded to the winning team will be 3-0 and the winning team will be awarded three points. If, through clerical error of the US Youth Soccer Wisconsin State Championship Committee, a team is deemed a NO-SHOW (meaning, the team appears in the competition schedule but did not enter the tournament), the remaining teams in the group shall be awarded a win and a score of 1-0 and awarded three points (forfeit penalties do not apply in this regard).

3001 ALCOHOL & DRUGS

Players in the Wisconsin US Youth Soccer Wisconsin State Championship are prohibited from consuming alcohol or using illegal drugs. Players are also prohibited from using any form of tobacco at the field(s) of play. Violators may be banned from the remainder of the competition.

All other participants (coaches, spectators, etc.) are prohibited from consuming alcohol or using illegal drugs at the sidelines of any US Youth Soccer Wisconsin State Championship game. Violators may be subject to dismissal from the playing area. Law enforcement may be called by the Site Manager/Tournament Director to provide assistance to dismiss violators.

4001 REFEREES

Referees for all games including play-in games shall be assigned by the State Youth Referee Administrator (SYRA) or a designated Referee Assignor currently registered with the United States Soccer Federation.

Referee game fees are not included in the team entry fee and shall be paid to the referees at each play-in and group play game. Each team will pay 50% of the referee fees per chart below.

For semi final and final games, The US Youth Soccer Wisconsin State Championship Committee will refund the teams involved in these games a portion of their registration fee equal to the amount of the referee fees for that game. Reimbursement checks will be mailed to the listed team manager within 10 business days of the final game..

The fee structure as approved by the Wisconsin Youth Soccer Board of Directors follows:

5001 CHECK-IN PROCEDURES

5001.1 Group Play

The following information must be provided to the Group Play Site Coordinator more than 45 minutes prior to the start of the first game:

Team Check-in Information:

- Official State Team Roster
- Official Roster- all teams- signed by players (one original and four copies are required for check in)
- Official Game Day Roster – All teams are required to provide a game day roster, of the up to 18 players, eligible to participate in that match. This form is to be given to the referee prior to each game.
- Player Pass Cards (required for all players)

- State issued coach pass cards (required for all coaches) Coaches must check-in at registration to receive a wrist band to be on the players' sidelines for group play, semi and final games
- Manager pass cards – managers must check-in at registration to receive a wrist band to be on the players' sidelines for group play, semi and final games
- Team Information form
- Team/player/coach eligibility verification form
- Code of Conduct form
- Required additional player credentials
 - Medical Consent Forms (for club pass players not on the official team roster)
 - Waiver of Liability (for club pass players not on the official team roster)

5001.2 Play-in games

Each team must be checked in by the referee crew prior to kick off.

In accordance with FIFA rules, the safety of player equipment is at the sole discretion of the referee.

Each team is to provide the following for the Play-In Game;

- Official State Team Roster
- Official Roster- all teams- signed by players
- Official Game Day Roster – U16-U19 teams
- Player Pass Cards (required for all players)
- State issued coach pass cards (required for all coaches)

5001.3 Semi Final Games

When possible semi-final games, for an age group, will be played at the same time, if the final game is to be played the following day.

5001.4 Finals

Teams competing in the finals will be required to have an official team photo taken after all team members have signed the official team roster form, no less than 45 minutes prior to the final game.

6001 SITE SELECTION

6001.1 Group Play

Clubs and complexes may submit a bid to host group play games to the US Youth Soccer Wisconsin State Championship Committee. Hosts must be facilitated through a member club of the WI Youth Soccer Association. The "Bid to Host" document will be available on the WYSA web site and is on a two year bid cycle.

6001.2 Semi Finals and Finals

Clubs and complexes may submit a bid to host the semifinals/finals along with the group play weekend to the US Youth Soccer Wisconsin State Championship Committee. Hosts must be facilitated through a member club of the WI Youth Soccer Association. A

minimum of four fields are required to host the semi finals and finals. It is optimum to have six fields available for the semi finals/finals. The “Bid to Host” document will be available on the wiyouthsoccer.com web site and is on a two year bid cycle.

7001 FAIR PLAY & POSITIVE SPORTING CONDUCT RECOGNITION

7001.1

To promote the spirit of positive sporting conduct and fair play, the Wisconsin US Youth Soccer Wisconsin State Championship recognizes each team in each age group whose players, coaches and team members (spectators) exemplify the best in positive sporting conduct and fair play for the Good of the Game. Each team will be rated by the officiating crew in each group play game. Those teams exhibiting collective (players, parents and coaches) positive behavior will be awarded a five. Those teams collectively exhibiting negative behavior will be awarded one. Total possible point value will not be averaged through group play; therefore a maximum possible 15 points for each group play game (parents, coaches, players) (Effective September 8, 2005).

7001.2

Sportsmanship points are part of the tie-break criteria (Rule 2001.6). (See statement on sportsmanship and Referee Rating Guidelines). Coaches, players and spectators are encouraged to cheer on their team positively and are strongly discouraged from making remarks deemed inappropriate for youth sports activities which may include remarks intended to embarrass, intimidate, incite injury or insult team members or players, coaches and spectators or those of the opposing team.

7001.3

Clubs having teams participating in the US Youth Soccer Wisconsin State Championship will be eligible for Club Sportsmanship recognition. Clubs recognized for collective positive sporting conduct as averaged amongst all teams from with the same club for group play.

8001 US YOUTH SOCCER MIDWEST REGION II CHAMPIONSHIPS

WI Youth Soccer is a member of Region II comprised of the 14 Midwestern State Associations. Winners at the U13 to U19 age groups from the US Youth Soccer Wisconsin State Championship advance to the Midwest Region II Championships. Teams at these age levels represent their club and the State Association.

Each US Youth Soccer Wisconsin State Champion is expected to attend the regional tournament. If a team cannot meet its obligation to attend the regional tournament, it is the responsibility of the team manager (or coach where applicable) to notify the US Youth Soccer Wisconsin State Championship Chair in writing (via email or USPS) within 48 hours of the completion of the Wisconsin Youth Soccer State Championships. Failure to provide written notification as required above shall subject the team and the member club to a minimum \$3,000 fine assessed by the WI Youth Soccer Association.

8001.1 Regional Wild Card Teams

There are times when Region II may award the Wisconsin Youth Soccer Association the chance to nominate two teams (wild card team) for the regional championships. This wild card team, in the instance where there is a championship game in the age division, shall be the age group state champion finalist. In instances where there is no championship game in an age group the Wisconsin Youth Soccer Championship Committee shall appoint a team as the wild card team.
